Community

Spanning 250 square miles, Lodi Unified School District serves the educational needs of Lodi, North Stockton, and the surrounding rural communities. Located 35 miles south of Sacramento, in one of the richest agriculture areas of San Joaquin County, Lodi was named Wine Enthusiast Magazine's 2015 Wine Region of the Year. Currently LUSD oversees 50 sites including preschool programs, 33 elementary schools, 7 middle schools, 4 comprehensive high schools, 2 continuation high schools, alternative education, including independent study, community day and Middle College High School, as well as programs for students with disabilities. LUSD has a student body of nearly 30,000 students.

School

Tokay High School is a comprehensive 4-year public high school enrolling approximately 2000 students in grades 9 – 12. The present school site opened in 1977 but was officially established in 1972. Tokay High is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Tokay's student body population is 65% Hispanic/Latino, 18% White, 11% Asian/Filipino/Pacific Islander, 1% African American, and 8% other or not reported. Approximately 69% of our student population receives free or reduced lunch. Tokay offers over thirty clubs on campus, a very active student government, band, and Science Olympiad.

Curriculum

The academic program follows a 2 semester, modified-traditional schedule. Thirty credits per semester is the typical course load. Students take six, 55-minute classes per school day. Nearly all classes are year-long courses.

Advanced Placement Program courses are offered in Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science, Environmental Science, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, European History, Government & Politics, Human Geography, Microeconomics, Psychology, Physics 1, Spanish Language, Statistics, and U.S. History. Honor classes are offered in English, Science and Mathematics.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation and Rank

GPA is calculated using the associated grade points. Beginning in 9th grade, all subjects and correlated grades are included in this calculation. A minimum of 230 credits is required for graduation, as well as Algebra 1 (or equivalent). Honor and AP classes are weighted by one point for grades of A, B, or C. Class rank is based on cumulative weighted GPA.

There were 447 graduates in the Class of 2022.

Advanced Placement Results
